

PRESIDENT'S "SERMON"

The Battle to Secularize Our Society: The Next 10 Years

You've got to give the religious community credit for one thing: They never give up. They may lose some ground in advancing one of their causes in our society, but they invariably take another tack, approach the task from a different angle and hang in there for another 30-40 years.

Their fight against abortion has taken at least that long, and though the religionists may have lost that battle on some counts, they have managed to roll back the decision in small increments, such as winning on late-term abortions.

Or how about Creationism? Another example of the tenacity of religionists is their forceful attempt to impose the teaching of creationism in public schools in competition with evolution. They may have lost some ground with the celebrated precedent-setting Dover case, in which a conservative Republican judge ruled against the teaching of creationism in public schools, but the religionists quickly diverted to another strategy: inserting their religious point of view into history classes and revising history textbooks to emphasize the so-called positive impacts of religion on history.

Inflicting Religion on Us

The patience of religionists in pursuing their cause—which is inserting religion into every important facet of American life—is legendary, and their use of the legal system and politics for their purposes is skillful. In fighting abortion, they have used zoning laws to remove abortion clinics from some communities; they have imposed health statutes on abortion clinics that are virtually impossible to comply with, such as requiring 10 nurses for every doctor. When worse comes to worse, they are out there in front of the clinic, carrying signs that accuse the abortion seeker of fetus murder.

We cannot ever rest in the knowledge that we have won a case here and there. The believers are out there, looking for a way to inflict religion on us in one way or another. They remind me a little of gophers on a golf course: you fill up one gopher hole, only to find that they have popped up in another one. Our eight-year struggle under the dim-witted dynasty of George W. Bush and his cabal, who launched Faith-Based Initiatives and are pushing school vouchers, will not end so easily, especially since we have some 20 years ahead of us of conservative decisions by a Bush-packed Supreme Court.

Ahead: A Decade of Struggle

Faith-based initiatives will be especially hard to roll back because this religionist administration has, in effect, set up a political machine. Put simply, when the current government gives money to churches in the form of faith-based initiatives, they get church members to vote for them. Not quite like Tammany Hall, but perhaps it's even more effective; Tammany could never say, as Bush does, that god is on its side.

ATHEISM IS A CONCLUSION NOT A BELIEF

But we can't give up. We can't let ignorance, false ideas and wrongful beliefs creep into our society just because we weren't paying attention. I see ahead of us at least 10 years of battling the inroads that Bush's E-Z pass to religionists have bequeathed to us. We have our work cut out for us, and the strategies I suggest below are just a beginning:

- (1) **Lobbying**. We need to be as skillful as the religionists are at using our laws to achieve our goals. That means lobbying our representatives on the local, state and federal levels. We need to let our lawmakers know that we are watching them and holding them accountable for any infringement of the Bill of Rights in matters of religion.
- (2) **Become a voting bloc**. Never mind the adage that it's "like herding cats" to get atheists to act in concert. We've got to get politically hip and let candidates know that we are a powerful voting population.
- (3) **Become candidates and support our candidates**. Atheists are disproportionately well educated, scientific, practical-minded and articulate. Perfect for a candidate for political office! Come out from behind the water cooler, Atheists, and get into the political fray.
- (4) **Agitate for equal media coverage**. The religionists kvetched for 30 years, complaining that they didn't get equal media attention, using their buying power to put an arm lock on advertisers. The result: Now they carry more media weight than we could dream of. We Atheists have yet to make the media aware that we exist.
- (5) **Establish facilities and rites**. Let's face it, churches provide life-passage markers that often have little to do with religion. Weddings, funerals, baptisms—someone's got to do them. Something in us humans craves notice at points in our lives. We need to provide a place and pageantry worthy of these functions. A dedication of our offspring to science, say, instead of to a god or a religion.

I think it's going to take us a good 10 years to accomplish what we need to in order to stave off the religionists and establish both credibility and acceptability for Atheists. Join us: It may be the most meaningful battle of your life!

The Minneapolis Convention

Dear Editor,

During the American Atheists (AA) convention in Minneapolis on March 21-23, Dennis Prager, California radio talk show host, debated AA's Board Member Frank Zindler (now temporary AA president) on the topic, "Resolved: The Jewish god Exists," which you described in your article, "The Message from Minneapolis: Atheism is Sweeping the Country" [April 2008 issue].

Frank Zindler did a superlative job of undermining the flimsy rationale for the existence of the Jewish god. I would like to offer a few more nails in its coffin.

Prager defined his god as nonphysical—beyond this world. If completely nonphysical, how then did this god create, interact with and dominate the physical universe?

Prager said that although religion cannot explain evil, atheism cannot explain the rest of the world. But it can. It's called science and it explains great portions of the extant universe.

Prager said, so what if his god cannot be defined or measured, neither can happiness, love or pornography. Happiness and love, however, can be, and are, being measured and quantified just like any other aspect of conscious emotion, by self report correlated with behavior, autonomic and hormonal variables. The last time I looked, the dictionary defined pornography as anything that is created explicitly to cause sexual excitement or arousal.

Prager says happiness, according to science, is simply the amount of serotonin in the brain. This reveals a profound naiveté about neuroscience. The brain circuits that underlie emotion utilize serotonin, norepinephrine, dopamine plus many more neurotransmitters, are distributed throughout diverse nuclei in the brain, are highly complex and have been evolving for hundreds of millions of years.

What's The Difference Between a Meetup and a Meeting?

Dear Editor,

I'm sensing that there are differences between an Atheist Meetup and an Atheist meeting, but I'm not sure what. How do I distinguish between the two? Or should I?

Dear Althea,

There are indeed differences between a Meetup and a meeting, though the two are often confused. If you are like me, you have, until recently, associated the word "meetup" with two people getting together; you "meet up" with someone. Whereas a "meeting" could involve any number of people getting together for a purpose. But all that has changed in the past few years with the advent of a new kind of "Meetup" on the Internet.

About five years ago, a company call Meetup Inc. hit the Internet. Its concept was so simple, you wonder why no one had ever thought of it before: It is basically a nationwide database or network of self-organized clubs and groups. Anyone can start an interest group on the Meetup site, pay a small fee to Meetup Inc., and have their meeting posted on the Meetup site. The Meetup organization will publicize it and make it easy for like-minded people to find you.

What a wonderful idea. A central data bank listing thousands of interest groups, help in finding your interest group, and email reminders of meetings--all for a small monthly fee paid by the Meetup organizer. Though that's a marvelously global idea, somehow the Meetups soon became associated with Singles, meeting persons of the opposite sex and matchmaking. Meetup Inc. avows that this is not quite accurate, but let's face it, that's what the Meetup concept was initially known for.

Proud To Be An Atheist

The Meetup company claims that if you access the Meetup.com site, you will find Meetups for chess players, pug owners and Italian food lovers among hordes of other interest groups. Sure, but there is also that vague, unspoken implication hanging in the air and never really denied, that you will meet *single* chess players, pug owners and Italian food lovers of the opposite sex. And why not, some say: It's faster, cheaper, less time consuming and probably gives a truer representation of a person than an online dating service.

Not Just for Singles

"Some people have the general misunderstanding that Meetup.com is a place for singles to meet up," says Greg Benson, a New York City Atheists member who has led a couple of NYCA Meetups. "It has nothing to do with atheism, but it is a misunderstanding I have come across at a variety of Meetups."

Benson points out that the Meetup.com company claims it helps people do many diversified things such as:

- Find others in their area who share their interests
- Learn, teach and share things
- Make friends and have fun
- Rise up, stand up, unite and make a difference
- Be a part of something bigger—both locally and globally.

When NYCA decided to start our own monthly Meetup several years ago, we took these Meetup.Com goals to heart. We wanted to introduce newcomers to what the atheist movement is about, what NYCA is about, our goals and our actions, and hopefully lead them to understand the possible ongoing role of Atheism in their lives.

Unfortunately, it didn't work out that way. Our early main Meetup leader was convinced that "socialization" was the most important goal of the Meetup. NYCA has no objection to socialization, but we do not feel that this is our main goal. In fact, we

have found it did not really work for us: Newcomers, mostly young, would come once, check out who else was there, and never come back again. They may as well have been "socializing" with pug owners or Italian food lovers.

Introduction to Atheism

NYCA's president Ken Bronstein discussed with our Meetup leader the possibility of changing the emphasis in the Meetups from socialization to discussion. Bronstein emphasized that while we are not opposed to those who wish to focus on drinking and partying with atheists, that is not our goal nor our preferred method of introducing people to Atheist activities.

Our philosophy about Meetups, and the format that our current Meetup leaders have agreed to: make attendees feel comfortable and welcomed, give an introduction to what we do and bring all into an incisive, in-depth and animated discussion about an Atheist event or an issue that is important to Atheists.

We allow for plenty of time for socialing, both before after the discussion.

The Better Way

Ironically, Ken Bronstein's goal of a deeper, more serious Meetup is probably also a better way for singles to meet and get to know one another. Drinking on a stool in a darkened bar beside someone does not really allow you to get to know somebody. But in an animated, in-depth discussion, a person's ideas, personality and character are revealed. So you can focus, during the social period, on getting to know those who interested you the most.

Come visit us on the third Tuesday of each month at our Meetup. You don't have to be a newcomer—you just have to like to get involved, discuss what's going on, meet new and old friends and find out what's going on in the exciting, volatile world of Atheism. Then join us at other times of the month for our regular meetings that include speakers, debates and actions such as the Pope Picket.

MAAF educates military leaders about the nontheistic worldview, ensuring that MAAF members have the support of their chain of command without fear of discrimination because of their lack of religious belief. □
